Shop Tour - Will and Rachel - Woods of Wisdom April 13, 2012

Our April shop tour was held on April 13th, 2012 at 11 am at Will and Rachel's Studio at 14802 Holy Cow Ranch Road in Rapid City, SD. Will and Rachel invited us to their Rapid Valley studio to give us an overview of their technique for turning bowls from SD trees and trees from around the world, to demonstrate their carving techniques, and to view special artwork in their gallery. This is Will and Rachel's working shop where they are always preparing items for shows and displays. Last year was a year for publicity and moments in the spotlight. Will and Rachel were featured in three magazines and one woodturning symposium brochure. Will and Rachel were featured in the Spring2011 issue of the ART of the HILLS magazine where they describe their adventures with woods indigenous to South Dakota including Russian Olive, Cottonwood, Elm, Walnut, Black Hills Spruce, and Box Elder. Then in August 2011, our local author and historian from Belle Fourche, SD, John English wrote a superb article for the American Woodturner magazine called "Embracing the Flaws – The Work of Will Bellucci and Rachel Scheffel. The next published work was in the FINE WOODWORKING magazine – it was considered to be the apex of Will's career by his father, who has read every FINE WOODWORKING Magazine since the first issue was published in 1975. In the September/October 2010 issue of the FINE WOODWORKING magazine, in the Reader's Gallery, Will's tupelo vessel is featured, with Rachel given credit for

the photography. In a brochure for a woodturning symposium in Minnesota, Rachel was featured on the cover amid a huge pile of rough bowls, and for this story, Will was given credit not as a woodturner, but as the Photographer! Finally, as of this publication, Will and Rachel are now featured in THE CUTTING EDGE! To view Will Bellucci and Rachel Scheffel's website gallery, visit www.woodsofwisdom.net.

They will soon be packing up their studio and moving it (with OLIVE) to Virginia, so if you haven't yet visited with them and toured their studio, plan to do so soon.

Rachel Sheffel showed us a few bowls that have been turned to rough size and have been curing for the last six months.





4TH ANNUAL WOODWORKING SHOW - SPECIAL REPORT Bob Buchanan

The Fourth annual Woodworking Show by the RCWA was the held on May 5, 2012 from 9 am until 4 pm. The event was held at Knecht's Home Center. Rick Weisbeck, our in-store coordinator, assembled our second RCWA display case last week and moved it to the lobby of the store. On Friday evening, May 4, members arrived to help Rick set up the central area of the store for the show. Knecht's provided chairs and tables, and members arranged tables and covered them with cloth, in preparation for the arrival of member's woodworking items to be displayed. Equipment to be used for the scroll sawing, woodturning, and toy making demonstrations was unloaded and put in place.



Early Saturday morning, signs made by Gary Graves were placed by Gary Kohama at strategic locations around Knecht's to direct people to the show.

By show time at 9:00 am on Saturday, the stage was set and the Show began. Members spent many enjoyable hours during the previous year, cutting, building, and finishing the projects that were brought together to share at the show.

Toy Workshop – Toy Program

Because the weather was so un-seasonably nice, we held two Toy Workshops in April to try and get a jump on the season. We met on Saturday morning April 14th and April 28th from 9 am til noon at the RCWA Shop at 910 Wood Avenue in Rapid City, SD.

Activites at the April 28th workshop were performed by twelve members and friends who worked at drilling holes/windows in wheeled vehicles, tracing turtle banks, cutting traced parts down from larger pieces into individual pieces, and initial sanding on cars, busses, banks and crayon vans. Others continued to trace a plethora of animal cutouts. Roger ordered our year's supply of wheels, axles and wooden balls, so work has begun to prepare them before they can be assembled to the wheeled vehicles. Many members took home boxes of wood to finish in their workshops/garages. This include operations such as initial rough sanding, the roundover routering, second phase of sanding using Mouse sanders, the sealing of the toy, and some piece part fabrication. Participating members included Gary, Denise, Harley, Frank, Grant, Julian, Larry, Steve, Bel, Kathie, Darwin and Bob.




